OVERVIEW OF LSU

LSU comprises eight campuses stretching across Louisiana and includes more than 60,000 students and research expenditures amounting to more than \$543 million, and growing each year. Within LSU are two health sciences centers offering various levels of degrees in medicine, dentistry, allied health, nursing, public health, and graduate studies. The LSU Agricultural Center encompasses both extension responsibilities and agricultural research. The Pennington Biomedical Research Center is a premier research institute specializing in chronic disease, diabetes, and obesity. LSU Shreveport offers degrees at the undergraduate and graduate level and has an emerging online presence. LSU Alexandria is a four-year institution serving the central region of the state. LSU Eunice is a junior college offering degrees and certificates in health, business, and liberal arts.

LSU's flagship campus, located in the state capital of Baton Rouge, is Louisiana's premier public institution. It is a land-, sea-, and space-grant institution enrolling some 39,000 students studying in nearly 200 bachelor's, master's, doctoral, and specialist programs. The flagship campus includes the Paul M. Hebert Law Center and the state's only School of Veterinary Medicine. There are more than 5,000 employees with a budget of more than \$1 billion on the flagship campus.

Over the past 20 years, LSU has consistently produced finalists and winners of the Rhodes, Truman, Goldwater, and Udall Scholarships. Several of LSU's programs are ranked top in the nation, including the Robert Reich School of Landscape Architecture in the College of Art & Design and the Internal Auditing program in the E. J. Ourso College of Business, which is internationally known as one of the top such programs in the world. LSU faculty and students contributed to the 2017 Nobel Prize in Physics with the discovery of gravitational waves, which were predicted by Einstein but not previously recorded. And Forbes recently recognized LSU among the top 20 universities in the country that dominate in both academics and athletics.

A lot is happening across all of the campuses, and it is an exciting time to be at LSU. From preserving the state's coastline and protecting its \$2.4 billion seafood industry to finding improved treatments for cancer, diabetes, and heart disease, researchers at LSU are contributing to breakthroughs that impact the everyday lives of the people of Louisiana, the nation, and the world.

LSU seeks a dynamic person to serve as LSU President who can lead the continued effort of positioning LSU as one of the nation's top public research universities. In recent years, LSU has worked tirelessly to bring in top faculty members who have achieved national and international recognition, an increasingly diverse student body, and larger and more successful incoming classes. As LSU continues its distinguished research and scholarship during this era of intense competition in higher education, it becomes more important than ever to find the right leader to champion the university's values and to nurture the manifestation of those values within the individual colleges.

OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT

The Office of the President provides overall leadership, vision, and direction for the Louisiana State University System ("LSU System"). The LSU System is the flagship system of public colleges and universities in Louisiana and includes the following locations: Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College at Baton Rouge (designated by law as the premier flagship university for the state); Louisiana State University at Alexandria; Louisiana State University at Eunice; Louisiana State University at Shreveport; Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center at New Orleans; Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center at Shreveport; Louisiana State University Agricultural Center; and Pennington Biomedical Research Center. The University of New Orleans is expected to become a part of the LSU System in 2026.

LSU is governed by the LSU Board of Supervisors, composed of two members from each congressional district and three members from the state at large, appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate.

The LSU System has more than 60,000 students, including online enrollment. Of those, more than 42,000 are undergraduate students, over 15,000 are graduate students, and more than 3,400 are professional students in health sciences, law, and veterinary medicine programs. In 2024-25, LSU granted more than 6,800 bachelor's degrees, over 5,300 master's degrees, 363 doctoral degrees, 855 professional degrees, and 853 associate degrees/certificates. LSU has more than 3,400 full-time equivalent faculty members, including 1,500 tenured or on tenure-track. The LSU System has an endowment with a market value larger than \$1.2 billion, approximately \$489 million in annual research expenditures, and 197 active licenses.

PRESIDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

The President, as the chief executive for both the LSU System and the LSU A&M campus (a land-, sea-, and space-grant Institution), will provide strategic and collaborative leadership in developing and advancing aspirational goals and plans to achieve LSU's mission of fostering firstclass learning, the discovery of innovations, the development of Louisiana's human capital by applying research and scholarship in advancing intellectual, personal, and professional growth.

The President, as chief executive of LSU A&M, will advance the generation, preservation, dissemination, and application of knowledge and cultivation of all academic areas of study on the campus.

The President, as required by the current LSU Bylaws, will establish administrative policies and procedures; implement educational policies; coordinate the activities among the various campuses; prepare and present a consolidated budget; serve as government liaison and spokesperson for the university to the alumni, news media, and the general public; and promote the general welfare of the university in its several parts and as a whole. The President is a member of all faculties and serves as chair of all Faculty Councils. The President is the chair of the LSU Leadership Council, consisting of the Chancellors and designated University Officers.

The President is expected to:

- Develop, periodically review, and maintain a long-term policy, programmatic, and operational agenda that incorporates the needs of students, the Board of Supervisors, faculty, staff, administration, state legislators, alumni, and business and community stakeholders.
- Provide effective leadership and support for all academic programs to achieve excellence in instruction, research, and outreach.
- Provide effective leadership and support for a program of student life that complements academic programs and recognizes the interests and needs of the student body.
- Support and mentor the leadership of all campuses of the LSU System and build a culture of understanding, mutual trust, collaboration, and shared accountability to ensure academic, research, and fiscal excellence across all locations.

- Serve as the primary spokesperson for the LSU System, promoting the university's interests and managing its reputation with external stakeholders.
- Establish and maintain effective relations with the executive and legislative divisions of the state and federal government, the national academic community, and other relevant constituencies.
- Manage the fiscal resources of the LSU System and of the LSU A&M campus and provide leadership in obtaining the financial and human resources necessary to accomplish the mission of the university.
- Provide leadership in philanthropic activities to support LSU, coordinating and supporting efforts by the LSU Foundation, LSU Alumni
 Association, and the Tiger Athletic Foundation.
- · Provide direction, support, and appropriate control over the intercollegiate athletics programs within the LSU System.

- · Demonstrated ability as a strong, credible, and effective communicator and a good listener in all situations
- Demonstrated ability to effectively consider and weigh all relevant information and perspectives and make good, informed, thoughtful
 decisions in a timely basis
- Demonstrated success and continued willingness to build a culture that is never satisfied with average performance or the status quo
- Confirmed track record of building teams that deliver outstanding results based on their focus, teamwork, and collaboration both internally and externally
- Willingness to develop a true appreciation and love for LSU and Louisiana, its people, and its traditions, and incorporate that perspective into the vision and everyday decisions
- · Significant academic accomplishments and an earned terminal degree sufficient to gain the trust and respect of the faculty
- Outstanding financial and budgetary skills and a working knowledge of the issues facing universities, academic institutions, academic medical centers, and the academic research enterprise
- · Established history and successful track record of administration and leadership in a complex higher education environment



The Flagship Campus



LSU FLAGSHIP CAMPUS

LSU's flagship campus in Baton Rouge sits on more than 2,000 acres of lush landscaping along the Mississippi River. The campus, widely considered to be one of the most beautiful in the country, is known for its Italian Renaissance-style architecture, tranquil lakes, and majestic live oak trees that are valued at approximately \$45 million.

LSU's Memorial Tower, one of the campus's best-known landmarks, as well as the War Memorial on the Parade Ground and the Memorial Oak Grove, all honor those who have given their lives in service to the United States during various wars and conflicts throughout our nation's history. The campus is also home to the Indian Mounds, which are two Native American earthworks dated to be more than 6,000 years old-older than the Egyptian pyramids.

Patrick F. Taylor Hall is the largest academic building in Louisiana and one of the largest freestanding academic engineering buildings in the nation. The Business Education Complex, the Manship School of Mass Communication, and the LSU Union are other noteworthy buildings. LSU's Tiger Stadium, well-known by college sports fans, is one of the largest college football stadiums in the nation. Known as Death Valley, the stadium has a reputation for being one of the loudest in the NCAA, and LSU is famous for its spirited tailgating atmosphere.

With anticipated completion in spring 2026, the Our Lady of the Lake Health Interdisciplinary Science Building will be a nearly 200,000-squarefoot, four-story epicenter for academics, research, and industry collaboration able to accommodate as many as 1,150 students, faculty, and researchers at a time. Construction on the new 193,000-square-foot Library & Learning Commons as well as a Construction & Advanced Manufacturing Building is set to begin in 2026.

GLOBAL VISION, GLOBAL IMPACT

LSU, the state's flagship university, is **in the elite 1% of universities in the nation with land-, sea-, and space-grant research**, offering programs in all areas of science, engineering, humanities, arts, and social sciences.

LSU is a member of the Laser Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory (LIGO) Scientific Collaboration, a dynamic group of scientists from around the globe collaborating to detect and study gravitational waves. **LIGO's Louisiana facility first detected gravitational waves in 2015**, proving Einstein's General Theory of Relativity in a groundbreaking discovery that contributed to the Nobel Prize in 2017.

The LSU Center for Internal Auditing is the **premier internal audit program in the world** and is a model for similar programs in other schools and countries.

LSU is one of 21 universities and colleges in the U.S. designated as a **Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Operations** by the National Security Agency.

LSU's Center for Academic Success (CAS) is a leader in student learning support. The International College Learning Center Association (ICLCA) has recertified CAS as a **Learning Center of Excellence** for 2024-28—making LSU the only institution in the world to receive this honor three times.

A statewide partnership led by LSU won the **largest grant ever awarded by the U.S. National Science Foundation** in 2024 for \$160 million to support Louisiana's energy industry.

LSU's School of Veterinary Medicine is **one of only 33 accredited colleges of veterinary medicine** in the U.S. The graduate program excels in research on equine health, vector-borne diseases, respiratory diseases, and molecular medicine and imaging.

The Manship School of Mass Communication is the **only one in the U.S. offering a political communication focus** at undergraduate, graduate, and PhD levels.
